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Rules & Expectations

Rules & Expectations. Please read and initial each item. (*Note: these are the same for Youth participants*)

_____ 1. I will attend all parts of the planned program. I will inform those in charge if I am not feeling well or need medical attention and cannot attend the scheduled activity.

_____ 2. I will observe established hours and be in the designated areas. I understand that there will be areas where I may not be allowed to go.

_____ 3. I will dress appropriately to the occasion. I will at all times, be courteous and clean, in dress and language, and display good manners. My language will be appropriate and respectful of others.

_____ 4. I will not leave the assigned program area, at any time, without permission of the person in charge of my group or activity. I will stay for the entire duration of the conference.

_____ 5. I will not bring or use alcohol, drugs (except those prescribed by my doctor), fireworks, firearms, pocketknives, or weapons of any kind. If I see anyone breaking this rule I will report it immediately. *Note: possession or use of marijuana on campus is illegal according to Federal law.*

_____ 6. I will be responsible for all my personal property.

_____ 7. I will respect other's personal property and personal space and I will keep my hands to myself.

_____ 8. Shoplifting, theft, or vandalism of public or personal property will not be tolerated. I will not be a part of this kind of activity and will report any such activity that I am aware of.

_____ 9. I will avoid roughness and damage of room furnishings, furniture, equipment, etc. I know that I am responsible for any damage or misconduct.

_____ 10. I know that the conference encourages interaction among all members attending, but not exclusively with one person. I know that kissing and other sexual displays of personal affection or harassment distract from the group and are not appropriate behaviors and I will refrain from them.

_____ 11. I will not use tobacco products outside of specified times and locations. I will NOT distribute to minors.

_____ 12. I understand that iPods, cell phones and other electronic devices are not allowed to be used during workshops or conference activities.

_____ 13. Additionally, as an Adult Supporter, I will attend youth workshops as a support to youth, not as a participant.

OFYC 2018 Solution Tracks for Participants

[Youth will be split into three groups to problem solve during the conference]

Quality of foster homes/providers: Legislators, foster parents, and youth have all highlighted a need for “homes of healing”. How can we improve screening and inspections? How can youth know that their foster parent is able to support them? How can we be sure youth are in the level of care that meets their needs?

Preventing houselessness: There is a housing crisis in Oregon. What can DHS Child Welfare do to support foster youth find, and move into transitional housing? What opportunities do youth need to practice their transitional living skills?

Supporting youth 18-21 (including preventing human trafficking): What support do you need after you turn 18? How should foster care supports change? Also, there has been federal legislation passed intending to keep foster youth from being trafficked. How should Oregon be implementing this law? How can caseworkers be trained to better support youth who have been trafficked? How can youth feel safe to talk about their experiences?
